Introduction

The Zámba Heritage concept is an African-led initiative promoting the protection, conservation, restoration, and sustainable use of forest landscapes. Zámba aims to drive collective action across nations by promoting Sustainable Forest Management (SFM), demonstrating verified certification impact, and advancing innovative financing and sustainable business models. This approach directly aligns key the Second Africa Climate Summit (ACS2) themes, including nature-based solutions, green growth, and just transitions.

Africa holds 20% of the world's forest resources, including the Congo Basin—the second-largest tropical rainforest globally, its share of benefits from the global trade in forest products is a mere 3%, has the highest rate of deforestation globally, which threatens vital ecosystem services, forest—based enterprises, local livelihoods, and climate resilience.





Zámba responds to this urgency by combining forest certification, sustainable business models and the supply of documentable ecosystem services and its impact on landscapes.

Led by a consortium of governments, civil society, and international organizations, and coordinated by FSC Africa, Zámba aims to scale transformative forest stewardship across the continent.

Alignment with ACS2 priority themes

Nature-based solutions:

- <u>Bringing</u> 30 million hectares threatened with degradation and loss under sustainable forest management by 2035
- Restoring 5 million hectares of degraded forest landscapes restored
- Increasing Africa's share of the glo9bal economic value of the forest sector
- 1,000 forest-based green enterprises
- 10 million households benefiting directly or indirectly

Regional & cross-border collaboration:

- Coalition spans 24 countries in Central, West, East, and Southern Africa
- Strategic partnerships with COMIFAC (Commission des Forêts d'Afrique Centrale (Central African Forests Commission), CAFI (Central African Forest Initiative), AFR100 (African Forest Landscape Restoration Initiative), UNEP Africa (United Nations Environment Programme Africa) and others

Just transitions:

- Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities at the center
- Strong gender and youth engagement frameworks
- Country-led business models.

Innovation:



- Verification of ecosystem services via FSC tools
- Support carbon finance models aligned with Article 6.4 of the Paris Agreement
- Landscape-level interventions co-designed with Governments and other local actors
- Transformed business culture that promotes trade in sustainably produced goods and services.

Current status and achievements (FSC Africa to date)

- Countries engaged: 14 governments in formal or informal dialogue with Zámba
- FSC-certified forest area: Over 10+ million hectares in Africa
- **Ecosystem service claims:** 05 verified impact projects across Congo Basin and Southern Africa.
- Market impact: Forest management certification, businesses based on sustainable supply chains, chain of custody certificates and verified ecosystem services claims increasing across Congo Basin, Southern Africa, and East Africa.
